

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# Program Instructions

## HARDWARE REQUIREMENTS

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* program is contained on two diskettes. It is programmed to run on the Apple II+™ or IIe™, DOS 3.3 microcomputer with 48K of memory and a single disk drive. A color TV or color monitor is preferable, since colors are an essential lesson in the total vocabulary. A color monitor is also preferable for clarity of the graphics.

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* is designed to be easy to operate even for the computer beginner.

## GENERAL OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Plug power cords (computer and monitor) into an outlet.
2. Turn the monitor power switch to the “on” position.
3. Open the disk drive door and insert the disk with the correct side up (Lessons 1–12 are on disk one; Lessons 13–24 are on disk two). Follow the disk insertion instructions provided by the computer manufacturer. Close the disk drive door. If the computer has multiple drives, use the “boot” drive.
4. Turn the computer power switch to the “on” position. The disk will “boot” automatically. The monitor screen will stay blank for a short time and you will

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detect “activity” in the disk drive. The disk drive light will glow and the drive will be audibly active. Actually, it will produce alternately humming and whirring noises which should not alarm you.

5. When the program has loaded, its initial frame will appear on the screen. Subsequent instructions for continuing the program will appear on the screen.
6. The “Caps Lock” key must be down on the Apple IIe.
7. To remove the disk, wait until the disk drive light goes off. Then open the disk drive door and gently pull out the disk. **Never remove a disk when the disk drive light is on.** This would “break” the program and possibly damage the disk and/or drive.

### Notes to the Beginner

If you are not familiar with microcomputers, here are three important facts to keep in mind:

- First, you cannot break the computer. Only physical abuse can do that. Do not worry about pressing the wrong keys or making mistakes. The worst thing that might happen would be to lose the current program in memory. If that happens, you need only reload the program.
- Second, the computer will always do what you tell it to do. Sometimes, though, what you tell it to do is not what you want it to do! The most common error is to misspell a command. That may cause unexpected messages to appear on the screen. Normally, you will need only to reenter the command correctly.
- Third, pushing the reset key allows you to “break out” of the program. Occasionally, you may wish to terminate a program prematurely or go back to the beginning: the reset key allows you to do so. Hitting the reset key unintentionally also results in breaking the program. If you wish to “partially disable” the reset key, follow the instructions that came with your computer for changing the switch position on the encoder board.

### DESCRIPTION OF THE PROGRAM

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* program is based on the *Basic Vocabulary Builder Duplicating Master Book* by Dorothy Gabel Liebowitz, published by National Textbook Company. The computer program consists of twenty-four lessons that reinforce 286 common nouns, adjectives, and verbs. The program is available in Spanish, French, German, and Italian editions.

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* is a menu-driven program, which allows the user to choose from the outset any of the lessons at any of the three levels of difficulty offered by the program. An entire lesson (three levels) can be completed by a beginner in approximately 15 minutes, and in much less time as the user masters the vocabulary.

Each lesson covers one facet of everyday life (see Appendix A, Menu, for a list of lessons) and reinforces twelve words. Each word appears on all three levels, with a different activity for each level. These activities are:

**Nouns** (Lessons 1–19)**Level A**

Identification of noun (object or person)<sup>1</sup>

**Level B**

Addition of definite article to noun<sup>2</sup>

**Level C**

Pluralization of definite article and noun<sup>3</sup>

1. Some nouns exist only in the *plural*. See Appendix G, Language Notes, for a complete list of these words in the language you are studying.
2. For nouns that exist only in the *plural*, the correct response requires the plural of the definite article and noun. See Appendix G in the language you are studying.
3. The program contains a number of nouns that are generally used only in the *singular*. Therefore, the correct response for these nouns at Level C is the singular form, the same as it is for Level B. See Appendix G, Language Notes, for a complete list of these words in the language you are studying.

**Adjectives** (Lessons 20–21)**Level A**

Identification of adjective (masculine singular)

**Level B**

Identification of adjective (feminine singular)

**Level C**

Pluralization of adjective (masculine plural)

**Verbs** (Lessons 22–24)**Level A**

Identification of verb (infinitive form)

**Level B**

Identification of verb (first person singular of present tense)

**Level C**

Identification of verb (first person plural of present tense)

Appendix C contains a list of the responses accepted by the computer as correct for each level of each lesson.

Individual words are represented by more than 280 high-resolution color graphics. In most lessons, graphics are presented in a random order to prevent the user from memorizing the words in sequence. Random presentation ensures that the user is actually learning the vocabulary and makes it possible to use the program repeatedly and still maintain a vital interest. Only Lesson 20, Description, deviates from the norm, for reasons which are specified later in this Guide.

All instructions to the user, menus, and feedback are presented in English. But positive reinforcement words and phrases of praise are presented in the specified foreign language. Responses must be entered in the foreign language. Correct spelling and accents are required. Several keys of the Apple II+ and IIe computer have been redefined to accommodate the accent marks required for each language. The location of these keys is specified in Appendix D. A separate card is also provided which shows the location of the redefined accent keys for each language. This card should be placed on the computer in a prominent, easily accessible place for quick reference while typing.

The accent keys are operated by holding down the “shift” key and pressing the redefined accent key.

To provide an incentive for the user to repeat the lessons and improve performance, the *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* records the time it takes for the user to work through each level of each lesson and offers a variable point system for

correct responses. The time accumulates in minutes and seconds from the instant the cursor appears to the instant the user pushes "Return" to enter a response or to get help. If the first answer is incorrect, the clock begins again and stops when the second response is entered. The time accumulates on the screen throughout the lesson. The total time for the lesson is shown on the Evaluation Frame at the completion of the lesson. The user should strive to reduce the time it takes to respond correctly on subsequent repetitions of the material.

The point system works as follows:

<b>Response</b>	<b>Feedback</b>
Correct on first attempt	5 points plus praise in the foreign language
Incorrect on first attempt	Correction message in English
Incorrect spelling on first attempt	Spelling correction message in English
Correct on second attempt	3 points plus praise in the foreign language
Incorrect on second attempt	Correct response displayed; no points awarded
Incorrect spelling on second attempt	Correct response displayed; 2 points awarded

Points accumulate on the monitor screen throughout the lesson and a point total is given on the Evaluation Frame following the completion of each level of a lesson. A percent figure is also given, showing the percentage of correct responses. The user can work toward accumulating a larger number of points in less time. A list of the words that the user misses on the first attempt is also shown on the Evaluation Frame. The user can copy this list of missed words in order to do better on the second attempt. If five or more words are missed, it is suggested that the user repeat the lesson. (See Appendix E for a copy of the Evaluation Frame.) After viewing the Evaluation Frame, the user returns to the menu to repeat the lesson, work on a different lesson, or to end the program. If "End" is selected, the computer displays a performance frame, or Performance Summary. This shows the user's name, lesson(s) completed for that session, and a percentage score for each lesson and level completed. This information can be used to determine overall performance and specific strengths and weaknesses (for example, those who can readily identify nouns but have difficulty determining which definite article to use with each noun). Such information can serve as the basis for remedial work on or off the computer. This information can be printed out if a printer is available. A copy of the Performance Summary is provided in Appendix F.

### **HOW TO USE THE *BASIC VOCABULARY BUILDER ON COMPUTER***

This program can be used effectively by anyone, from elementary school age through adult. All that is required is a basic familiarity with the foreign language structures used (singular and plural nouns of both genders, singular and plural

articles of both genders, singular and plural adjectives of both genders, first person singular and plural of the present tense) and the ability to recognize graphics of common articles, actions, and qualities. The user need not be an accomplished typist, but familiarity with a typewriter keyboard is helpful.

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* is highly interactive, requiring frequent user response, and simple to operate. After the user has “booted up” the disk according to the General Operating Instructions on page 1, the title frame appears, followed by copyright information. Then a “menu” appears listing the lesson numbers and titles for Lessons 1–12, plus #13, “End.” (The menu for Lessons 13–24 is on the second disk.) The user chooses a lesson, types in the corresponding number, and presses “Return.” The program proceeds as follows:

- A. The user chooses an activity level (A, B, C), types in the corresponding letter, and presses “Return.”
- B. The user types his or her first name and presses “Return” (capitalization is unnecessary). Nine letters are allowed.
- C. The user types his or her last name and presses “Return” (capitalization is unnecessary). Twelve letters are allowed.
- D. The computer, addressing the user by name, states the objective of the program and lists the general instructions for the program’s operation:
  1. The required word(s) must be spelled and accented correctly. Capitalization is not required except for German nouns.
  2. Pressing “Return” enters the user’s responses.
  3. Responses are timed and points are given for correct answers.
  4. If the user does not know the answer, “Return” can be pressed to end the attempt and receive the answer.
  5. A small bird (  ) signals the user to press “Return.”
- E. The user decides whether or not to see examples for the lesson and level selected. If examples are desired, the user types “Y” for yes, and then:
  1. The computer tells the user what response is required for that lesson and level, then demonstrates by providing the correct response. Time and points are not given for the computer-worked example.
  2. The computer repeats the instructions and instructs the user to use the left arrow (←) key to erase typing errors. Then the user enters a response. If the response is correct, the user is praised and apprised of the point value for a correct response. If the response is incorrect or incorrectly spelled, the user is allowed to try again. If the response is incorrectly spelled on the second attempt, the user will receive only two points. Praise and three points are given for a correct response on the second attempt. No points are given for an incorrect response on the second attempt. At the completion of this example, the user pushes “Return” and begins the selected lesson and level.
- F. If the user chooses not to see examples, “N” should be typed to begin the lesson.

G. The screen format for all examples and lesson frames is the same:

Instructions are displayed at the top of the screen.

Points accumulate <u>here.</u>  00	The graphic to be identified is at the center of the screen.  	Time accumulates <u>here.</u>  00:00

Feedback to the user appears below the graphic.

The user's response appears here.

- H. At the completion of an entire lesson at one level, the user receives his or her evaluation, then presses "Return" to go back to the menu.
- I. When #13, "End," is selected, the Performance Summary is displayed, showing the user's performance record for all lessons and levels completed. If a printer is available, this Performance Summary can be printed out.
- J. The user presses "Return" to go back to the menu.

## FOR CLASSROOM APPLICATION

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* can be used in several ways. It can serve as a review of material previously learned in a foreign language class. Specific activities or lessons could be assigned as a remedial activity for students experiencing difficulty in a particular area. Since it is an acknowledged fact that computer use is, in itself, a reinforcing (and fun) activity, the program could also serve as a reward for classroom performance. The gamelike aspects of the program (accumulation of time and points) could be monitored in such a way as to stimulate students to better their own (or someone else's) performance. The Performance Summary can be used to keep track of student progress.

The program may be used effectively as an independent activity or may be paired with the *Basic Vocabulary Builder Duplicating Master Book* for a total approach to vocabulary learning. If the computer program is used in conjunction with the book, there are several important points to consider.

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* is not an exact duplicate of the *Basic Vocabulary Builder Duplicating Master Book*. As with translating material from one language to another, translating material from print to the computer necessitates a certain amount of change.

The *Basic Vocabulary Builder on Computer* and the original *Basic Vocabulary Builder Duplicating Master Book* differ in the following ways:

- A. The computer program is available in Spanish, French, German, and Italian editions. Russian is not available.
- B. The book contains thirty-two lessons; the computer program contains twenty-four. The following were deemed inappropriate for inclusion in the computer program: Lesson 13, Numbers; Lesson 14, Telling Time; Lesson 15, Shapes and Containers; Lesson 25, Animals, B; Lesson 28, Tools and Materials; Lesson 30, The Calendar; Lesson 31, Holidays and Celebrations; and Lesson 32, The Map.
- C. Lesson numbers in the book do not correspond to those in this program. Lesson titles have been retained, with the exception of Lesson 9, Miscellaneous, which has been retitled “Description” (Lesson 20) on the computer.
- D. In the computer program, Lessons 1–19 deal solely with nouns, Lessons 20–21 with adjectives, and Lessons 22–24 with verbs.
- E. Lessons in the book generally contain 16 vocabulary words or phrases; computer lessons usually have 12 words or phrases.
- F. When a word in the book is given more than one possible translation (example: The word “pants” in Spanish is translated as either *calzones* or *pantalones*), one word has been selected as the more common and is accepted exclusively in the computer program. Appendix G lists the words that are given synonyms in the book. It also lists any words that have been changed from the book. Check Appendix C for the word(s) accepted by the computer as correct.
- G. The computer program contains a number of nouns that are commonly used only in the singular and are not usually given plural forms. The Level C activity for nouns involves changing the nouns to the plural form. For the exceptions, however, usage demands that the *singular form* be retained for Level C. For example, on the French program, the singular form of “salt” plus the definite article (*le sel*) is the correct response for Level C as well as for Level B. For a complete list of the nouns used only in the singular form in this program, see Appendix G, Language Notes.
- H. Computer Lesson 7, The Family, is handled somewhat differently from the other lessons in the program. In order to make the role of each family member perfectly clear, each person’s “portrait” has been labeled in English. Thus there will be no mistaking which relationship is indicated when multiple possibilities exist (for example, a daughter may also be a mother, sister, aunt, etc.).
- I. Computer Lesson 20, Description, deals entirely with adjectives. Six pairs of adjectives with opposite meanings are reviewed. To clarify which quality is being indicated, the graphics in this lesson are not presented in a truly random sequence. Each pair of opposites will always appear in back-to-back frames (examples: “tall” will always follow “short”), but the pairs will appear randomly. The “shortness” of a person or object might not be apparent if seen in isolation but is when placed in conjunction with a “tall” person or object.

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- J.** Computer Lesson 22, Health; Lesson 23, Activities; and Lesson 24, Sports and Recreation, are composed entirely of verbs. These lessons in the text are a combination of nouns, adjectives, and verbs. The computer lessons use verbs that are closely allied to the nouns and adjectives in the book. (For example, the Italian adjective for "sick" is *malato*, -a. In the computer program, the verb-adjective phrase, "to be sick," *essere malato*, is used.)
- K.** Some of the computer graphics have been changed slightly from those used in the book:
1. Lesson 1, Colors, in the duplicating master book uses pictures of objects representative of the various colors. Lesson 21, Colors, in the computer program does this also, but pink has been substituted for red, as the Apple computer does not produce a true red.
  2. Lesson 19, Transportation, in the duplicating master book shows a sailboat; Lesson 11, Transportation, in the computer program shows a motorboat instead.
  3. Computer graphics for Lesson 12, School, and Lesson 15, Occupations and Professions, which show people involved in school and job activities, do not correspond in gender with the pictures in Lesson 20, School, and Lesson 23, Occupations and Professions, in the book. The user's response must reflect the *gender* of the person pictured.
  4. Four new computer graphics were added to Lesson 20, Description, to illustrate "cold," "hot," "good," and "bad." In the text, the phrases "to be hot" and "to be cold" are introduced in Lesson 27, Seasons and Weather. "Good" and "bad" are not included in the book.
