Drag all of the files to the System folder icon on your hard drive.

- Next, open the System folder icon on your hard drive.
- You'll need the following folders in your System folder. If you don't have them, select and drag them from the StyleWare.TD disk to the System Folder on your hard drive.

System.Setup Tools Drivers Fonts

- If you have these folders, open each of the folders and select all of the files in each folder by holding down the *shift* key while clicking each file or choose the Select All command from the Edit Menu.
- Drag the files to their respective folders in the System folder on the hard drive.

Full Finder compatibility enables you to open TopDraw by double-clicking TopDraw document icons. You must, however, copy the program files listed below to the boot volume in order to take advantage of this compatibility. If you prefer to copy TopDraw to a subdirectory (folder), you must access files created with TopDraw by double-clicking the TopDraw icon then choosing the Open command from the File Menu in the program.

To copy TopDraw to your hard disk drive:

Click and drag the following files to your hard drive icon (or a separate TopDraw folder created with the New Folder command from the File Menu).

You can select more than one at a time by holding down the *shift* key while you select them.

TopDraw TD.Defaults Drawings

If these files exist, you'll see a dialog box informing you that they exist, and asking you if you want to replace them. Click the "Replace this item" button.

When you've finished the installation, enter the Control Panel and reset the startup slot to the slot containing your hard drive interface card.

Errata to TopDraw Manual 1.10

Changes have been made to the TopDraw program that are not covered in this version of the *TopDraw User's Manual*. This errata sheet will alert you to these changes and explain how they will affect your use of the program.

◆ Text Objects

(User's Manual p. 14)

A text object can be filled with None, any solid color, or any pattern from the pattern palette. Selecting None as a fill pattern for a text object will make the area behind the text appear transparent. You can change the fill pattern to None by dragging the paint bucket icon to the None pattern box on the pattern palette or by clicking the None pattern box.

The line pattern affects the color of the text in your text object and can be any solid color. If you choose a pattern which is not a solid color for a line pattern, the text will be a randomly chosen solid color. The None pattern cannot be chosen as a line pattern for a text object. Although the line size commands affect all other objects, they will not affect a text object in any way.

New System Font

To make menus, menu items, and dialog boxes easier to read, the font used in all program labeling has been changed for version 1.10 of TopDraw.

Menu Order

For greater ease of use, the order of the menus in TopDraw has been altered to reflect their logical relationship with each other. The Edit and Arrange menus are positioned together because they affect the way you create and edit objects. The View, Option, and Windows menus affect your use of the program and the appearance of your documents. Since you are likely to access commands consecutively from these menu groups, they have been placed side by side.

◆ Palette Placement

In the original version of TopDraw, when you closed a document, the palettes remained on the desktop in their last used positions. When you close a document in version 1.10 of TopDraw, the palettes disappear, displaying an empty desktop.

The Choose Font Command

(New on the Font Menu)

In previous versions of TopDraw, use of fonts was restricted to the 15 fonts that could be displayed on the Font Menu. With the new Choose Font command, however, you can access all the fonts on your program disk during a TopDraw session. Use the Choose Font command to choose any font style (Plain, Bold, Italic, Underline, Outline, or Shadow) or specify any text size between 4 and 127 points.

Once the Choose Font command is highlighted in the Font Menu, a dialog box appears on your screen displaying a list box containing the fonts in your System folder.

■ To choose a font, click the font name in the list.

If necessary, scroll the list until the name of the font appears in the scroll box.

- Click the check box for the style or text option you wish to use.
- To choose a text size, either use one of the predefined sizes listed for the font or specify a nonstandard size by entering any whole number between 4 and 127 in the box labeled Other Size.

TopDraw will approximate any point size within that range if it can't find the specified point size as a font file.

Installing TopDraw on a Hard Drive

(User's Manual p. 171)

TopDraw uses certain versions of a number of the files located on the TopDraw disk. To install TopDraw on your hard drive, these files must be copied to your hard drive or, if they already exist, they must be updated. Since TopDraw is now Finder-compatible, instructions for copying all of these files using the Finder are given below.

First copy ProDOS 16 to your hard drive.

■ Enter the Control Panel by pressing the *control*, *option*, and *esc* keys simultaneously.

■ Choose Slots from the Control Panel menu and change the boot slot to slot 5.

Press return until you are out of the Control Panel and reset the machine.

■ Insert the TopDraw disk and turn on your Apple IIGS and hard drive.

The Finder desktop appears on the screen, along with icons representing the TopDraw disk and the hard drive. The TopDraw disk icon is labeled StyleWare.TD.

- Open StyleWare.TD by double-clicking its icon.
- Select the ProDOS icon in the StyleWare.TD window and drag it to the hard drive icon.

If you already have ProDOS on your hard drive, a dialog box appears, informing you that "The File/Folder 'ProDOS' exists" and asking if you want to replace it. Click the "Replace this item" button in the dialog box.

The next file you'll want to copy is the TopDraw.Icons file. If you don't have an Icons folder on your hard drive, move the entire folder. If you have an Icons folder, copy only the TopDraw.Icons file.

- If you have an Icons folder, open the Icons folder on the Styleware.TD disk and select TopDraw.Icons.
- Drag the file from the StyleWare.TD disk to the lcons folder on your hard drive.
- If you don't have an lcons folder, select the lcons folder and drag it to your hard drive icon.

You'll need certain system files to run TopDraw. You can copy these files from the System folder on your TopDraw disk. Please copy only the files indicated in the following procedure into the System folder on your hard drive.

- Open the hard drive icon and the System folder icon on your StyleWare.TD disk.
- Select the following files by holding down the *shift* key while clicking each file.
 - P8 P16 Start Finder
