

Addition/Subtraction 4 Learning Programs

Basic Addition Facts: How many apples are in the apple tree? The basic facts of addition are presented using the horizonal/vertical methods. The concept of carrying numbers is introduced to facilitate correct problem-solving.

Basic Subtraction Facts: How many marbles did Johnny borrow from Bob? The beginning aspects of subtraction are introduced through both the horizonal/vertical methods and the borrowing of numbers from other columns of numbers.

Addition Problems: Ann gave Thomas 14 apples. He already had 10 apples. How many apples does Thomas have now? Practice your quickness and skill adding columns of numbers ranging from two to six digits.

Subtraction Problems: Ann sold 13 of her 20 bunnies. How many bunnies does she have left over? Broaden your skills by subtracting numbers ranging from one to six digits arranged in column format.
