

Jim Hogin, National Account Executive for Apple Computer, who operates out of the Apple Minneapolis office in Appletree Square, will be the speaker.



This is the time of year for magazines to publish special issues on Educational Computing. Twin Cities Computer User set aside October as Computer Learning Month. They sponsored a series of computer awareness presentations at the Minneapolis and St Paul downtown libraries, featuring such speakers as educational author Joe Nathan, who spoke at our July meeting, Ray Douglas, host of KSTP's program "Computer Talk" and our own Connie David, who computer runs а transcription service. At the September SIG meeting about 15 persons saw two Apple co-processors demonstrated. These devices speed up the Apple's internal operations by using a faster internal clock. This allows in memory processing to be very fast, about 3.5 times faster.

These devices are different in that one board contains its own memory, and the other board does not, but uses the Apple memory. The devices differ in some small ways, but the major differences are the memory, and the resultant difference in price. The unit with memory is about twice the cost of the other.







OM #33 comes to us from the Northern Illinois Apple User's Group (NIAUG) via the International Apple Core (IAC). The disk contains three hi-res games in color submitted to a contest run by NIAUG in 1983. The games were all created using a piece of software from Broderbund called the "Arcade Machine". The games are called Beach-Head, Westward Ho!, and Bee Crunch. All the games require a joystick or game paddles.

There are some general instructions that apply to all the games. Strike: (ESC) To pause/then any key to continue (SPACE) To restart and hold hi-score (RESET) To restart and zero hi-score (RE-BOOT) To select another game.

The specific instructions are:

Beach-Head

You are all alone in your tank, trying to protect the beach against the landing of enemy You must also watch out for the

snipers that are hidden on the beach. Use the paddle to move the tank left and right and game button (0) to fire your gun. There are also unfriendly aircraft strafing the beach. I don't know if the tank can shoot the aircraft (translated that means I couldn't hit any). You have three "tank lives".

Westward Ho!

The Indians have attacked the wagon train. You the trusty scout have a gun and nine lives to protect the gentle settlers. Beware of the "riderless" horses because they also shoot arrows. You however are such a terrific shot that you can shoot the arrows out of the air. Also watch out for the large boulder on the bluff and the moving cactus. Use both game buttons to fire in either direction. There are at least two levels to this game. observed some inconsistency in the scoring in the game - I seem to lose points for no apparent reason.

Bee Crunch

This can be a two player game with each player using a game paddle. Each paddle controls one of the arrows at the top or bottom of the screen which are your shooters. You gain points by killing bees or the other player. You will however LOSE points if you destroy 1) "the friendly snake", 2) "the lovable little frog" or 3) "the adorable bee hives". You have three lives to lose.

the Mac. It currently is only available by mail from them. I talked to them and was impressed with what seemed to be a very honest, direct approach on doing business. You use the driver installation program to replace the Imagewriter driver on whatever application disk you wish to talk to your MX-80. The installation takes only a couple of minutes. The MX-80/100 ROM version known as Graftrax Plus is required. A serial interface with 2K print buffer (Epson model no 8145) is also required on your MX-80 (or MX-100). The same card will also work in an RX or FX. Other Epson manufactured interface cards will not work with the MX. See SoftStyle below. Price is \$102. The card plugs into the Epson printer's motherboard. You have to take off the case to get at it. The cable then plugs into the interface board. Alternatively, you might be able to use one of several boxes converter serial-to-parallel appearing on the market. It is claimed that Mac MX produces printed images in the correct aspect ratio. I plan to order the Mac MX and will report on it.

SoftStyle — is the company which makes the product that Epson is advertising. This is also a software driver (Epstart) and a serial interface. It works with the FX series only. It makes use of firmware features such as character download that are only available in the FX. Also, according to one source, the resulting aspect ratio is not correct. The 8145 card and Epstart software sells for \$129. Alternatively you can use an un ffered version of an interface card model no 143 at approximately \$55 not including Epstart. There is also a HanZon card which, together with cable, sells for \$129. There is also an Epson manufactured card with an 8K buffer which will work with the FX.

Simulation Process - is the company that makes the "Mac Daisywheel Connection". They also have a product for the new Epson LQ1500. As some of you may know, the LQ1500 is Epson's new "super" printer sporting a 24 wire head. It has an excellent quality "letter quality mode" achieved through the high dot density coming from the 24 wire head. Supposedly the Mac driver for the LQ makes use of the 24 wire head resulting in a quality of print which is only surpassed by the upcoming laser printers. Many thanks to Mike Carlson of Hagen who helped me gather some of this information.

The Daisy Wheel Connection - November MacWorld compares ProPrint, Mac Daisywheel Connection and LetterWare, 3 software packages that allow one to print to a daisy wheel printer instead of the Imagewriter. I found the article, though good in certain areas, completely lacking on one subject. How do these drivers compare as far as handling proportional spacing in right margin justified mode? Only ProPrint and Mac Daisywheel Connection handle Proportional, but what happens interword spacing? Anyone know?

Color Mac - still a hot rumor that Apple will release this animal at January stock holders meeting. Software developers supposedly working on color software.

Disk Drives - Apple may well introduce a hard disk for the Mac in January, probably a version of the Profile. They are also expected to introduce a high capacity hard disk which will work on the AppleBus as a file server. There is always the possibility that Sony will get its act together and make double sided drives available so we can have 800 Kbytes per drive! By the way, the November 5th edition of InfoWorld has an interesting review of the Tecmar and Davong hard disks. They say that the performance of the Tecmar is much better than that of the Davong, mostly because of software differences.

Habedex, the same outfit that makes the software, are close to releasing a small size 3 1/2" drive for the Mac. There will probably be other manufacturers trying to get a piece of that action.

Laser Printer - We still expect to see the Apple Laser printer also announced January.



peeDemon is a co-processor speedup board that uses a 65C02 microprocessor operating at 3.6 Mhz clock rate to take over processing from the Apple 6502 which operates at a 1.02 Mhz clock rate. This results in a significant increase in the speed of internal operations.

This board will work with any Apple][,][+, or //e. It is slot independent, and will work in any slot except slot 0, (slot 3 on //e). It accesses the Apple memory, including memory expansion boards.

The following is a rundown of the characteristics of the SpeeDemon. It works with any Apple software, Applesoft, Pro-Dos, Pascal and 80 Column cards. It starts on power up, but can be disengaged by an ESCAPE from the keyboard to bypass it. SpeeDemon is transparent, requires no pre-boot, and will work with CORVUS hard disks. The SpeeDemon slows down when accessing peripherals and the game port. There is a built-in self test.



Call Dick at RAMCO SALES 572-9305 In my experience the SpeeDemon delivers what it says it will. It has an honest 3.5 times speed up for in memory operations. Since our software operations include a mix of tasks to be done there may not be that kind of advantage in overall operation. The operation of the device can be startling, or it can be quite subtle, but it works to decrease total time of operation. I use it with BPI General Ledger, which is a clunk as far as speed is concerned, and cut processing time by about half. I have seen graphing programs run on SpeeDemon equipped systems, and the generation and display of the graphs or charts is notably faster.

This device should really shine in doing sorts on databases, and is great with spreadsheets. Overall, a boon for business applications.

Yes, you may play games with SpeeDemon in operation, but the games may run fast! This could result in the game being un-playable. On the other hand, we might think of it as a new and greater level of challenge in game playing! And of course, with slow games it is a real help.

I was once accused of writing a review that was so glowing, that it was assumed that I was "throwing roses" (not being objective). So, is all rosy in the garden? No, there have been problems experienced.

In one instance, when running in the fast mode the Apple bypassed a clock card before it could respond. In discussion with the owner of that system, it appears the problem is one of how and where the clock card is being used, and can be solved by moving the clock card. Also, there is a jumper on the SpeeDemon board which can be removed that will slow down I/O access to slots 4 & 5. As I take it, a clock card or any peripheral device requiring a normal operating speed should work if located in one of those slots.

The only software problem has been in trying to run DB Master version 4.0 which has something to do with some timing changes on some tracks that are part of the copy protection. There is no problem running DB Master ver. 3, or ver. 4+.

On boot, an ESCAPE in the first 2 seconds after power-on takes the SpeeDemon off lin and the boot proceeds at normal speed. On mpersonal system I have to do two or more

n the September issue of this newsletter, I reported the change in the distribution of Lock Smith 5.0 since Omega Microware filed for bankruptcy. Lock Smith is now distributed by Alpha Logic Business Systems:

I wrote them a letter explaining that I had ordered and paid for a subscription to the Lock Smith newsletter (\$12.00), and asked them if they would honor my order. I received a prompt reply from Alpha Logic explaining that they would be unable to honor the subscription orders taken by Omega because of the large number of subscriptions on record. Instead, they offered to give me a subscription to the newsletter for the first year at a discount price (\$6.00). I took the offer and felt that I had been able to salvage something from that.

At the same time I ordered a diskette containing the Lock Smith parameters that have been published to date. At \$8.00 this disk saves a lot of typing and de-bugging when entering parameter changes.

More problems with subscriptions:

At the September board meeting someone told me that SofTalk had ceased publication. "Oh great!" I said. "I just sent them a check for renewal yesterday!" I figured that was the last I would hear about that \$18.00.

Well, this week (Oct. 3rd) I got my check back by the good graces of the Post Office. The envelope has all sorts of offical red rubber stamp marking on it, which add up getting my check back because SofTalk's business reply permit was not renewed! Wheew!

That is better than I faired at the hands of Small Business Computers. Many months ago I sent them a subscription order for two years. Over a period of months I received about three issues, which included apologies for delays and an extension on the subscription. There has been nothing since then. Well, I am reconciled to the fact that that is all I will may rer get from them.

My last tale of magazine woes involves Peelings II, a publication that was very heavy on product reviews and comparisons. A sample copy showed up (who do I have to thank for that?), and it was well regarded. A Little More on WPL

here have been several articles in recent Mini'app'les Newsletters dealing with the Word Processing Language (WPL) in Applewriter II. The article by Arsen Darney (June, 1984) described a Low-Cost, "No-feature" Data Base. I am currently using it for a particular set of information I need to have handy when working with Applewriter. He also suggested several other uses for WPL. Richard Loggins has published a series on a WPL Address Book program in Apple Orchard (October, 1983 to February, 1984). Chuck Boody had a copy of the WPL Address Book program at one of the Business SIG meetings. The WPL Address Book program works well with small (<100) files.

I needed a particular type of utility, specifically the ability to print out all of the files on a disk without having to sit and load each one individually. The WPL manual (for the //e) has a short program to load the catalog into memory. The sequence in a WPL program is OAD\$A#, where \$A is used to select the drive. Once the catalog is in memory it can be manipulated with the find and replace function to generate a numbered file with the names of the files that are to be printed. This directory is then saved to disk and each file is loaded and printed within the WPL loop. As with all WPL programs, this one is used by typing [P] and then DO PRINT FILES or whatever name you save the program under.

The [L] in the last statement is actually an inverse capitol L in the workable WPL program. The control-L is inserted by typing control-V control-L control-V. The command clears the screen. The value of x is set to 1 for future use in a loop.

FILE PRINTER PROGRAM ppr ppr This program will print out all ppr unlocked text files on an AWIIe ppr file disk. Make sure to lock all WPL programs because the control characters do strange things to ppr the printouts. ppr ppr Drive to Print: =\$A pin

The header section describes the program and its major limitation. Then comes the command that loads the catalog into memory. The "p"s are necessary and there are five typed spaces after the first p. The catalog will not load completely without the five spaces.

This is the section of the program that manipulates the catalog file in memory to produce a file that can retrieve each file as a string. Each find statement replaces the file name and other information with the appropriate structure for generating directory file. The file name is replaced with nothing if it is locked (Note the statements with the * right after delimiter, #) or not a text file (Note the A and B after the # delimiter). For unlocked text files an appropriate identifier is introduced in front of the file name. In this case it is the value of x in \diamondsuit brackets followed by a carriage return and then three apostrophes. The strange looking sequences are Applewriter's way of being able to use certain symbols as delimiters while also using symbols in the document without driving WPL up the wall.

A loop is now used to number the file created in the previous section. The value of x is reset to l and directed to the beginning of the file. We find the <> brackets and replace whatever is in there with the current value of x. Next l is added to the value of x and the program is directed to replace the value in the next set of <> brackets, and so on until the <> brackets are not found. The program adds a single < bracket to the end of the file and saves the file to disk as Directory.

X is again reset to 1, the file name in <1> is loaded and the program loops to load the assigned string into memory and then prints it. X is incremented and sent back to load the next file. If none is found the instruction to go to the file loading section is skipped. The screen is cleared (with the [L]), the bell is rung (with the [G]) and the program waits for a return to continue.

The final section of the program deletes the directory file that was used to load and print all the files, clears the screen and leaves WPL.

The nice part of WPL is the ability to do some of the more tedious tasks automatically (or more conveniently). I sometimes wind up trying to save a file on the text file disk only to get a disk full message. I then have to find a disk, initialize it and then save my file on it. I wrote a WPL program to calculate the remaining sectors on a disk. certainly not unique as I could use FID, but that would require booting the Master disk, running FID to get the free sectors and then rebooting AWIIE. The program is similar to the file printer program except that the catalog to memory file is not saved to disk. The file is manipulated to give just the sectors for each file and then each string is added to z (the to y and accumulator). The sequence is looped until no more strings are found. 64 sectors are added to the total (z) so it is the same as determined by F1D. Y is now assigned 560 and z is subtracted from it. The program gives the number of files, the number of used sectors and the number of free sectors. It is a little slow, but much more convenient than rebooting everything. GOTO 20



In the change of Club officers some time ago the International Apple Core membership was inadvertently forgotten. That bill was paid and the IAC has acknowledged our check.




