## From the Editor

As you will notice, this August issue of the Newsletter is not the usual 32 pages. I hope to explain why we decided to print an abridged newsletter.

In an informal poll of Mini'app'les members we found that, if a choice was necessary, most members wanted a newsletter which was timely rather than necessarily 32 pages. I myself have found the monthly calendar and list of meetings to be a vital link between the members and the meetings arranged for their benefit, and that this information was one of the primary reasons for publishing any newsletter.

It has been decided by the Newsletter staff that each issue from now on will aim to be timely, but whether it consists of anything beyond the calendar is not guaranteed. I hope that our contributors understand that this step is necessary to preserve the Newsletter's usefulness to the membership.

Members have said that the newsletter was the best membership benefit, especially for those who cannot attend meetings. We have a number of people who worked on the Newsletter to thank for that. It has been said that the newsletter kept people in the club.]

Up until several months ago, the major part of the Newsletter production, layout, and coordination was done by the editor with help from many others. However, it is too big a job for a single volunteer who also has to earn a living. The editor resigned from the post and the present staff was organized and a new distributed production plan was attempted.

As is true of most things, a quality newsletter takes considerable time and effort to produce. Our plan was to divide the responsibility for sections of the Newsletter among new members and current staff.

Since the June issue, putting together the Newsletter was intended to be a team effort. However, the process

of substituting, say, three people for the work previously done by a single person does not mean each person does only one-third as much work as before, since communication and coordination become vitally important.

This model of how material for the Newsletter would flow was proposed by a board member two years ago, and we are closer to following that plan than we have ever been. But it doesn't work. Because the staff has no meetings when we are all in one place for an extended period, we cannot work together. We have to rely on massive donations of personal time for coordination from a distance, communication, disk exchange, transportation across the metro area, and hardware & software sharing.

Humans reproduce in nine months. Putting nine people on the job will not get it done in a single month, however.

The club does not even pay for the sheets of printer output for the final copy. A victim foots that bill every month, including working proofs. If you get laser printer output from Kinko's, they charge \$.50 for every sheet, including working copies and proof pages. And you still have to rent the time on the machine and allot personal time. Freelance layout artists typically charge between \$40 to \$60 per page of finished output, not including writing or editing. If our 32 page newsletter were laid out by a commercial printer, it could cost over \$1000 every month, not including the printing. That is the magnitude of this project every month.

The Newsletter staff had some difficulty putting together the July issue, which was a full 32 pages, but for several reasons was considerably delayed.

The Newsletter staff has done, I feel, an excellent job on production and layout the last several issues. In each case, however, individuals on the staff have taken it upon themselves to complete each issue. Because of the failure of our production plan for the Newsletter, this was the only way these issues were finished at all.

I don't know what the solution is. Should we try to make the distributed plan work (coordinate the separate sections, distribute material, assemble the finished pages) or is some other procedure needed? Everybody who works for the club—board members, SIG directors, newsletter staff, contributors, officers—volunteers their time and effort because they want to see the club succeed at its goals.

What should we do to prevent burnout of our volunteers?


