Spam Cop Report

Thirty to fifty emails a day, most of it spam- Is this you? If it is I'd like to tell you about spamcop.net. For a charge of \$2.50 per month, you can set up a spamcop.net email account that is virtually spam free. You can also set up your existing email accounts to have your mail forwarded to the spamcop.net account for filtering. And if you want, the spamcop account can be set up to forward the filtered email to your primary ISP email account.

I currently have 4 email accounts. My mac.com address was very simple to set up mail forwarding. Simply click on the "mail forward" button and type in an email address. For my primary email account with charter.net, I set up a second "clean" email account

that I've not used online before. This is optional. It's easy to configure your email program to go to spamcop.net and fetch your mail there. But I preferred to have my mail forwarded from spamcop.net back to my new email address at Charter. I had to call Charter to have them set up email forwarding to the spamcop.net account.

When the mail gets filtered through your Spam Cop account, any mail that is set aside as spam is not automatically tossed. It is held at spamcop and until you look at it and give it the thumbs up or down. This prevents an important message from being tossed without you seeing it. You might think that it is the same amount of work whether you are tossing messages at home or going to spamcop.net to toss them. But I've

found that I'm more efficient at home and I look forward to my email more than I used to. And it's very fast to look at the long list of spam being held at spamcop.net and click one button to toss it all. When I was getting the spam at home, I had to click on each message and delete.

That's it. So far so good. So far I've found the service works as advertised. Coming home after 4 days away recently, I had over 150 messages to wade through. Now with spamcop, I'm getting less than 10 emails a day. And none of it is spam.


As mentioned this meeting will be held on April 20, 2002 at St, Charles School located at 2727 Stinson Blvd, Mpls.
