Installing a Battery in a fruity imac

I've had my lime colored imac DVD slot loader for four years & in that time it has worked just fine for me. The only hardware problem I've had is that the battery went dead after 3 years. The problem showed itself by my computer time being incorrect and turned to Jan 1,1904, with several programs acting up or not working. To fix the problem, I took the imac to an uptown Apple authorized repair shop and they installed a new battery.

I must admit that at the time I thought \$ 57 for putting a battery in the imac was a stiff price, but knowing nothing about computers, I was reluctant to try installing a battery myself. The consolation in having it installed by a professional was that a battery should last from 3-5 years.

Shortly after the battery installation, I asked Bert Persson, a computer knowledgable club member, if he had ever installed a battery in his computers. He said he had installed many and that it really wasn't that difficult a job. Although he noted he had never installed a battery in an imac, he thought if you read the repair manual and took care that it shouldn't be that difficult a job. In the back of my mind, I thought when the battery goes out in 3-5 years, I'll try installing it myself.

Unfortunately, the battery didn't last 3 years, but went dead in less than a

year. I was tempted to have a professional install another battery. The only thing that stopped me was the thought of having to install a new battery at the cost of \$ 57 every year or less, plus the hassle of delivering it to the repair shop (a 40 mile drive for me). I decided to try installing the battery myself using the rational that if I ruined the imac it would give me an excuse to upgrade to a G4 or G5 Mac.

I sent out a request for information on the Miniapple BBS and received good advice from several club members (Michael Rehbein, Tom Gates & Dave Peck) who directed me to web sites that discussed battery installation and what care should be taken in changing the battery. Unfortunately, the web sites discussed changing batteries in the older imacs which were not exactly like my imac DVD slot loader. The older models had a somewhat different case and required the removal of the logic board mass storage chassis to access the battery.

With determination to install the battery myself, come what may, I searched the Internet for a battery. Fortunately, I found Mac-battery.com who sells batteries and parts for Apple computers. They asked what kind of imac I had and sent me a 3.6 volt lithium, 1/2 AA type Tekcel battery which I received in 2 days from Memphis. Accompaning the battery was complete printed instructions in color on how to install the battery.

The cost of the battery with shipping was only \$ 6.88.

Much to my amazement, installing the battery was easy. I removed four screws and took off the plastic case. The next operation was removing 6 screws and the metal (EMI) shield covering the computers inner components. The old battery was easily removed and replaced by the new battery. In all, the operation took me about 1/2 hour. I was very careful and deliberate in removing the plastic casing & inner shield and if I did it again I could probably replace the battery in 15 minutes or less.

The challenge came after I installed the battery. I could not reset the time and date on the computer, nor access the Miniapple BBS mail or one of my e-mail programs. I finally managed to reset the automatic date button in the Apple date & time menu. Surprise! When I restarted the computer the time & date were automatically set. The problem of access to the BBS & email program was solved by redoing some preferences.

Bert was right, with a little care and following directions it wasn't that difficult replacing the battery, plus it saved me a bundle of money.
