Approval of Agenda: Agenda approved with several additions.

Approval of Minutes: July 11, 2005 minutes approved.

Treasurers Report- All bills for the months paid except a bill received on August 1. A letter will be sent to Brian Bantz & Dave Lundeen acknowledging our receipt of money from the Naugsaw account. The letter will officially close out the account and no future action will be necessary.
