Fall In Love With Your Macintosh All Over Again!

As I was looking through the boxes I brought home from work, I found a button, a square button that said "Fall In Love With Your Macintosh All Over Again!" It was to advertise the new and improved System 7.5. At the time I had 7.1 on my Mac and was happy with it. Our department techie came around and installed 7.5 on anything that had Macintosh on it. For me it was fine as I had a 6100/66. but the little Mac Classic used by a colleague did a very slow dance. Unfortunately the upgrade he finally got was to a Dell instead of to a bigger and faster Mac. Anyway, I thought how appropriate that I should find this button for the February Newsletter. So all of you will have to give your Mac a big hug and kiss to let it know how much you appreciate it.

I also found a brochure for Newton Software Titles from 1993 (so now you know I'm a piler not a filer) with some interesting applications. This was one of Apple's ideas that was a bit before its time. I remember sitting in on a demonstration of the Apple Newton MessagePad and thinking that it was pretty neat, but I could do all that stuff with my Franklin Planner and my Mac. I didn't need a Personal Desk Accessory. Now I depend heavily on my Palm Tungsten T3 to keep track of appointments, ideas, tasks, interesting trivia, etc. It has become an indispensable part of my life. My wife has one as well and we keep track of just about everything with them. (Including how many games of Freecell we've won.) I've also found several genealogy programs that will run on my PDA thus increasing my time with the computer or the "little computer."

The weather has been rather dreary which leads one to crave a bit of travel and along with travel comes photography and the inevitable trip through Photoshop. I have a friend with a Dell computer using Photoshop and Photoshop Elements 2.0. He uses Photo Impressions, the program that came with his camera to download and process his pictures because the Adobe programs are too intimidating for him to even try and use. I recently spent some time with him and showed him how to do some scanning and photo restoration using both Photoshop and Photoshop Elements. It is amazing how much of Photoshop is in Photoshop Elements. I'm using Photoshop Elements 3.0 and it has a great quick fix editor. Sort of takes the fun out of spending a bunch of time and coming up with a great photo only to do a quick fix on the same original and have it look about the same. I'm also impressed with the upgraded version of iPhoto. I had iPhoto 4 and it took forever to allow a simple 90° rotation of more than one photo. With iPhoto 5, it's pretty impressive how fast you can choose a whole series of photos and do a rotate on them. I have over 2,000 images in my library and that's probably why iPhoto 4 was having a problem. I even downloaded iPhoto Diet but didn't have to resort to using it as I upgraded before that.

As I sit here typing this out, I have a black and white (Holstein) cat named Jackson sitting on my lap, keeping me warm and purring loud enough to keep me awake. He's our last cat as

our other one died this last week. Pets are nice to have but a computer is a lot more helpful. Both have unique disposal problems. I was reading in my latest issue of Chemical and Engineering News that a tremendous amount of outdated electronic equipment. 100 million computers, monitors and televisions in the US alone, become obsolete each year. A significant amount of this electronic trash winds up in China, India, Pakistan and Nigeria where the computers are broken up and the precious metals reclaimed. In the process, the plastic cases are burnt and workers are exposed to toxic fumes from chemicals such as nitric and hydrochloric acids and fumes containing lead, chromium, beryllium, mercury and silver. Some of these countries have laws prohibiting this practice, but there is apparently a lot of money to be made by processing old computers in third world countries, so the laws are not always enforced. It is not economically profitable to recover these resources in this country so shiploads of computer carcasses are sent designated as refurbishable equipment and then dismantled for components and precious metals. Several states have enacted a disposal fee as part of the original purchase price. Some of the recycling programs are government based and some are manufacturer based. The hope is this will provide an incentive for manufacturers to remove or reduce the amount of toxic materials in their computers.




