Product Review of the i-RIDE Bicycle Stereo System

The i-RIDE is a speaker system designed to be mounted on a bicycle for use with an iPod.

The i-RIDE is sold by Active Tunes, PO Box 2081, Ocean NJ 07712, http://www.active-tunes.com. The i-RIDE sells for \$29.99. My total cost including shipping was \$36.26.


I found this device while searching the Internet for some 'bicycle speakers'. I was expecting to find a story about how someone jury rigged some speakers on to a bicycle. What I found was a ready to install, easy to install, and reasonably priced speaker system designed with the iPod in mind.

Included in the i-RIDE are the speaker assembly (speakers), a mounting bracket for the speaker s, a stereo cable for connecting the speakers to the headphone jack of the iPod, a power cable for use off the bicycle

powering the speakers from a USB connector, and a pouch for storing the speaker s and cables off the bicycle and for securing the iPod for use on the bicycle. The only extras needed are three AAA batteries, an iPod loaded with tunes, and a bicycle.

I ride the National Multiple Sclerosis Society's The Ride Across Minnesota (TRAM) and used the i-RIDE on the TRAM and on my training rides. I mounted the speaker bracket on the handle bar of my bike. The pouch which holds the iPod comes with a velcro strap; I secured it to the gooseneck of the handle bar. The stereo cable is about two feet long so that the i-RIDE and iPod may be mounted in a variety of locations.

The speaker assembly consists of two wing-like speakers attached to a cylindrical base. The wing-like speakers fold and unfold for use and storage much like a butterfly. The speaker assembly snaps into the mounting



bracket for use. The speaker assembly may be removed by pressing on a release lever and lifting the speaker assembly. On the TRAM I did experience three or four instances where bumpy roads 'ejected' the speaker assembly. Lucky for me I had routed the stereo cable over the top of the handle bar and the right angle connector of the stereo cable held onto speaker assembly. I am going to look for a couple of heavy duty rubber bands (binders) for securing the speaker assembly. The Active Tunes folks recommend such use of rubber bands when mounting the speakers in an upside down manner.


The speakers are powered by three AAA batteries. On the TRAM I used Energizer 850 mAh NiMH rechargeable batteries. I estimate I got about nine hours of use before needing to swap out or recharge the batteries. Active Tunes supplies a DC power cable for the i-RIDE for use off the bike. This cable has a USB connector for connecting to a device such as a powered USB hub.

Don't expect any booming sound from the i-RIDE. The sound will be drowned out by passing flatulencesounding Harleys, snorting semis, and other loud vehicles. The sound will also be drown out by the turbulence of the air passing your ears at higher speeds. For me and my big ears that was generally above 15 mph; I average 12 mph so that was no problem.

How do they sound? Good. Darn Good! (My music qualifications: My last formal music training was a semester of 8th Grade Music almost 50 years ago. I received a 'D' one quarter and a 'C' the other quarter. As I have said many times "the only way I can carry a tune is in an iPod".)

Listening to tunes on the TRAM was great; I marched, polkaed, and waltzed up and down the hills. Tunes seemed to make the riding easier. On some of the harder hills I had people stay right behind me for the tunes. I did not see any other i-RIDEs on the TRAM. Several people inquired. I expect more i-RIDEs on the TRAM next year.

Final word: Whether tooling around Lake Calhoun or Phalen, or rolling along on the TRAM, the i-RIDE is great way to get your tunes.
