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LOADING THE PROGRAM



We feel that this program can be a useful adjunct to the more traditional classroom methods being employed today. Children and adults alike, in the home or the classroom, should find it a useful (and pleasurable) tool for the development of improved spelling skills. And if you have some fun along the way, remember this; there is no law that says learning has to be dull.

LESSON STRUCTURE

The diagram below shows the parts of the lesson. The arrows indicate how you can move around in the lesson.



LESSON OPERATION

We have designed this lesson to be easy for you to use. LESSON OPERATION, (choice A on the SPELLING MENU), tells you how to use the APPLE computer to do this lesson.

Moving around in the lesson

You choose where you want to go in the lesson and when. You are almost always free to leave any part of the lesson by returning to a menu. You can repeat any part of the lesson by choosing it again from a menu. Changes on the screen happen under your control. You move at your own pace.

Menus

There are two menus in this lesson (see Figure 1): the SPELLING MENU and the PRACTICE MENU.

From the SPELLING MENU, you may go directly to:

- (A) LESSON OPERATION
- (B) LESSON GOALS
- (C) SEE HOW TO SPELL
- (D) PRACTICE MENU

or you may return to the title page.

From the PRACTICE MENU, you may go directly to:

- (A) HOW TO USE
- (B) SEE/CHOOSE LISTS
- (C) STUDY WORDS
- (D) SPELL WORDS

or back to the main menu.

Keys to press

At the bottom of each screen there are instructions about what keys you can press and what will happen when you press them. If a key is "advertised" as active, it will work. There are no "surprise" keys that do something strange when pressed accidentally. The name of the key is shown in brackets `< >`, and what happens is described briefly next to the brackets. For example: `<1>` menu - means when you press the 1 key you will go back to the menu.

The keys you'll be using in this lesson include:

`<1>`

`<2>`

`<return>`

`<escape>`

`<space bar>`

`<a>` through `<d>` for entering choices

the number keys for choosing lists

`<a>` through `<z>` for typing spelling words

`<←>` (the left arrow key) for erasing

Instructions

The two spelling exercises, STUDY WORDS and SPELL WORDS, each have their own separate instructions. These instructions are available before and during the exercise. If you have already read them carefully and understand how to do the exercises, you can choose to skip the instructions and go directly to the exercises.

Convenience

The keys you'll use most in operating this lesson are keys which are easy to find and familiar to APPLE computer users.

Most screens have been labeled by title and page numbers. For example: LESSON GOALS 1 of 5

Display formats, location of instructions on the screen, and key functions are consistent for ease of use.

A color-tuning guide has been provided, as the last screen of LESSON OPERATION, for adjusting your monitor.

LESSON GOALS

LESSON GOALS, (choice B on the SPELLING MENU), tells you briefly what the purpose of this lesson is.

The goals of WHOLE BRAIN SPELLING are:

- * to develop visual imaging skills for spelling
- * to offer 200 ten-word lists for spelling practice
- * to diagnose and indicate areas for self-correction

WHOLE BRAIN EDUCATION is an approach to learning that combines "left brain" and "right brain" kinds of thinking. Along with your left brain abilities to reason, to apply rules, and to learn steps for doing tasks--you can also use your imagination, your right brain abilities to create and remember internal pictures, to trust your feelings and intuitions of knowledge.

WHOLE BRAIN SPELLING is intended to help you develop and use your internal visualization skills for improving spelling. Many words in English are spelled very differently than they sound. For example, the ough in the word "thought" sounds just like the aw in the word "thaw", but they look and are spelled very differently. Research (Simon, H. and Simon, D., 1973; Simon, D., 1975) has shown that good spellers use an internal image to see if a word they've spelled looks right. This visual information isn't a replacement for knowing how the word sounds, what it means, or what general rules are useful for spelling English. The visual information makes the crucial difference, however, for correctly spelling words that are not phonetic (ie., in which spelling and sound differ).

WHOLE BRAIN SPELLING is intended to teach you a method for learning HOW to spell. It is not primarily intended to teach you the 2,000 words in the lesson, or any other set of words. However, as you learn to focus your visual awareness, and practice using mental images to spell these 2,000 words, they will become more familiar and easier for you to spell correctly. You can use the method of making internal pictures of words in order to spell any words you see anywhere.

The lesson will be most useful for children already familiar with reading and writing (approximately fourth grade), high school students, and adults who wish to improve their spelling skills.

SEE HOW TO SPELL

SEE HOW TO SPELL, (choice C on the SPELLING MENU), explains the idea of internal visualization for spelling--seeing words like pictures inside your head.

The text is presented in large colored letters so that it will be easy to read and understand. Color contrast within the sentences helps you to focus on the main ideas. The drawings illustrate how pictures--and words as pictures--can be imagined in your mind's eye.

The screen that has the word SUCCEED in a box allows you to play with the way a word looks. You can change the color and the case (capital or small letters), show double letters highlighted, or show the word one letter at a time. You can change the word as many times as you like by using keys <a> through <d>. It's also fun to change color or case very fast by holding down the <repeat> key while pressing <a> or <c>.

This screen gives you an idea of how you can play with word pictures in your imagination.

It also shows some of the ways word pictures will look in the STUDY WORDS exercise later in the lesson.

PRACTICE MENU

PRACTICE MENU, (choice D on the SPELLING MENU), takes you to the second menu in the lesson. From the PRACTICE MENU, you can find out HOW TO USE the exercises. You can go to SEE/CHOOSE LISTS to select a word list from any of the 200 ten-word lists. (See WORD CHOICE CRITERIA in this manual to find out how the lists were compiled). Your current list number is shown at the bottom right of this menu. Each time you boot the disk, the current list number will be #1 until you change it in SEE/CHOOSE LISTS. You can also reach STUDY WORDS and SPELL WORDS from this menu. These exercises allow you to study and spell each word on your current list.

All parts of the lesson which you reach from the PRACTICE MENU will return to this menu. You can always return to the main SPELLING MENU from the PRACTICE MENU.

HOW TO USE

HOW TO USE, (choice A on the PRACTICE MENU), gives you an explanation of what the practice exercises are like and how you can use them to improve your spelling.

You can work with word lists three ways:

1. SEE/CHOOSE LISTS shows you a whole ten-word list at once and allows you to choose from 200 lists to study or spell.
2. STUDY WORDS allows you to study a list one word at a time, in large colored letters, by showing and erasing each word as you make a mental picture of it.
3. SPELL WORDS allows you to see and type each word on a list. If you make a spelling error, the program will show you which parts of the word you need to look at more carefully.

Although you can do the different parts of this lesson in any order you choose and skip easily from one part to another, *here's our suggestion for a good way to get the most out of the spelling practice exercises:*

1. Go to SEE/CHOOSE LISTS
Scan through lists until you find one you'd like to spell. Return to the menu.
2. Go to STUDY WORDS
Show and erase each word enough times to get a clear picture of the word in your mind's eye. Return to the menu.
3. Go to SPELL WORDS
Look carefully at each word, checking if your inner image of it is right. Type the word you saw. Study your answer to see if it looks right. Use the correction mark-up to see what letters are correct. Look at the highlighted letters the second time to strengthen your inner image of the whole word. Keep working until you've spelled the word completely correctly. Look at your correct word, and remember how it looks.

SEE/CHOOSE LISTS

SEE/CHOOSE LISTS, (choice B on the PRACTICE MENU), allows you to display an entire 10 word list on your screen at once.

You can flip back and forth (using the <escape> and <return> keys) through 200 lists to find one you'd like to study and spell.

The word lists are also included in this manual (WORD LIST RECORD) for rapid scanning and keeping track of your progress.

Lower numbered lists are easier. Higher numbered lists are more challenging. You can also follow the screen instructions for entering a list number. The number you choose will be displayed directly, and then you can still flip back and forth some more or choose to enter another number.

When the list you want is on your screen, return to the menu to study or spell it. Your current list number will be saved (it is shown at the bottom right of the PRACTICE MENU screen).

For very fast scanning (backwards or forwards), use the <repeat> key along with <escape> or <return>.

Every 25 lists you'll need to wait a few seconds for the disk to spin.

Remember that whenever you re-boot the disk, the current list number starts back at #1.

STUDY WORDS

STUDY WORDS, (choice C on the PRACTICE MENU), is an exercise for studying each word on your current list. This exercise will help you make pictures of the words in your mind's eye.

As you show and erase each word many times (by pressing the <space bar>), the "word picture" will change in ways that are interesting to see.

Words change color, cycle through four colors, or "rainbow." Double letters are highlighted. The word may be written in capital or small letters. It may appear one letter at a time. It may flash on and off, or flash from one color to another.

The idea behind the changing display of each word is to focus visual awareness on the LOOK of the word and to make word study interesting and enjoyable.

Each time through a given list, the words will appear in a different order. The visual changes to the words are also randomly selected, for variety and interest. The timing of flashing displays has been carefully designed for comfortable pace and ease of study. You control the timing of showing and erasing each word, so that you can move at your own individual rate.

During the exercise, you can choose to see the full instructions again, and your place in the word list will be saved. If you return to the menu, your place will not be saved.

SPELL WORDS, (choice D on the PRACTICE MENU), is an exercise which allows you to show and type each word on your current list. You find out right away whether your spelling is correct. If not, you'll see what part of the word to focus on, and you can spell it again.

The spelling word is displayed in large letters in a box. You can look at the word for as long as you like. When the <return> key is pressed, the word will erase and a prompt () below the box indicates where your typing will appear in large letters. The left arrow key (<←>) is available for erasing typing errors. When the <return> key is pressed again, your answer is compared to the correct spelling of the word.

If you have spelled the word correctly, it will be moved into the box. Your correct word will be shown in a rainbow of colors. You can then choose to spell the word again or continue to the next word on the list.

If you have misspelled the word, colored boxes will overwrite areas of your answer that are not completely correct. A caret (^) indicates missing letters. (See Figure 2 for an illustration of the correction mark-up.) When the <return> key is pressed again, the word is displayed once more in the box, and the parts of the word that you had trouble with are highlighted in orange. This highlighting is intended to help focus your attention: you correct yourself when you type the word again. You can make as many attempts as you like, or skip ahead to the next word at any time (except when the answer prompt is on the screen).

Each time through a given list, the words will appear in a different order. If you choose to read the full instructions during the exercise, your place in the word list is saved. If you return to the menu, your place is not saved.

This lesson features a special answer checking technique. The program analyzes each individual spelling, so that the correction mark-up and the highlighted orange letters provide specific feedback and focus for self-correction. Feedback is given in visual form so that your attention to the task remains visual throughout.



This exercise is not a spelling test. It is for learning, practice, and enjoyment. No scores are kept. You can use the WORD LIST RECORD in this manual to check off lists that you've learned to your own satisfaction.

WORD CHOICE CRITERIA

There are 2,000 spelling words in this lesson. They are organized into 200 ten-word lists graded for difficulty.

Systematic research and sound personal judgment based on teaching experience were combined to select these spelling words.

Because the lesson teaches a visual technique, the vocabulary level of the words is not as important as the level of actual spelling difficulty. Of course, it is also helpful to know how a word sounds and what meaning (or meanings) it conveys. However, for the purpose of internal visualization, words were chosen that are the most commonly taught in grade school and high school spelling materials and whose level of spelling difficulty has been identified and measured systematically.

Most of the words in the lesson were selected from the New Iowa Spelling Scale (see REFERENCES). The lists are arranged in order of increasing spelling difficulty.

- * The easier lists (1-72) include words spelled correctly by 30-60% of 5th graders in the Iowa nation-wide study.
- * The medium lists (73-121) include words spelled correctly by 50% or fewer of 7th graders.
- * The difficult lists (122-164) include words spelled correctly by 50% or fewer of 8th graders.
- * The "super challenge" lists (165-200) include words with very low accuracy percentages for 8th graders in the Iowa study, words taken from adult spelling improvement texts, and interesting and difficult words we have used in our adult classroom teaching.

There are also a few "fun lists", included within each difficulty category, that have a theme such as tree names, science terms and the like.

NOTE TO EDUCATORS

This WHOLE BRAIN SPELLING lesson is specifically aimed at developing internal visualization skills for spelling. It is not intended as a comprehensive spelling curriculum. The visual approach is a supplement rather than a replacement for classroom activities that involve auditory skills, word meanings and sentence context, and performance evaluation.



